**PASTORAL REFLECTION** 

Greeting friends in Christ,

Each time I sit to write a letter to you all, I find the previous month has passed more quickly than I would have thought. April has been a month of transitions as our Leadership Selection Team named nominees for the Governance Board and the Leadership Development Team in the new single-board model we are creating together. As a reminder, the Governance Board is at the helm of the church, directing it and steering it toward the vision God has placed on our lives. They work together to equip the pastor to empower ministries that the



church has created to live into its call from God. Leadership Development is a team that creates new leaders, grooming the future of the church's governors and ministers. Our ministries and our leadership developers are accountable to the pastor, the pastor is accountable to the Board, and the Board is accountable to the whole church.

We are intending to bring several items to you for an official vote on June 9, 2024 at 11:00 AM, where our District Superintendent, Rev. Dwayne Bagley, will join us once again to have us take a vote on these official motions:

- Official transition to the one-board model (Simple Accountability Structure)
- Voting on candidates for the Governance Board (6 total) and Leadership Development Team (3 Total)
- An update to the Central Church Vision Statement

Your presence is vital, as these changes cannot happen without your consent or your voice. Your vote **matters**. And you will shape the future of this church with the power you hold as members of Central Church.

Likewise, through the end of April and into the month of May, we are continuing a series titled The First Bible, a phrase that I have borrowed from Fr. Richard Rohr, OFM to describe the natural world around us, as well as God's omnipresence beyond and including the walls of the church. He posits the question, "where did the first people of God's world learn about God?" The answer is in the nature - the First Bible. Within God's world are evidence of God's grace, which we Wesleyans understand to be abundant and ubiquitous. Through the experiences of The First Bible, our faith ancestors wrote the books of religious history, vibrant and meaningful myth, poems, lamentations, and artistry to make sense of their experiences with God. And the best is that we still have access to this First Bible, we can experience what our faith ancestors experienced. Let's look for it together.

I am blessed to be serving at Central Church in this time of sacred change, to see your hopes rekindle, and to be witness to your holy laughter. May Spring remind you of the blessings of living in this world God has given us.


May Noisy Offering May 26
